Awards celebrate unique youth contributions

While Calgary's youth are often touted for their academic achievements, it's not every day that we recognize their broad range of contributions outside of school.

That's why the ConocoPhillips Youth of Distinction Awards, now in its 8th year, celebrates deserving youth ages 13-18 that bring vitality and leadership to their communities.

In addition, with prize money and recognition on the line, local schools with the most nominations are in a "Race to Nominate" their students. ConocoPhillips will award the top three schools with cash prizes to use however they see fit at their school.
