In fact, I'm pleased and proud to say that the youth in our programs gave an incredible 40,000 hours to community causes in 2010. This, in turn, helped many other organizations to better meet the needs of the community.

But, I have complete confidence that together with our funders, community partners, Board of Directors, Executive Director, staff, and volunteers, Youth Central is well positioned to continue making Calgary a great place to be.

Youth Volunteer Corps

The Youth Volunteer Corps (YVC) program began in 1993 and is Youth Central's largest program. The purpose of YVC is to provide meaningful team-based volunteer opportunities to young people between the ages of 12 and 18, in partnership with over 150 community agencies and events. The YVC Steering Committee, made up of 25 youth volunteers, plans Empty Bowls, a project that strives to raise awareness around the issue of youth hunger and homelessness while raising funds for a deserving youth serving agency in Calgary.


Youth Volunteer Corps in Schools provides students with the opportunity to improve, through **volunteerism**, their local **community** and **school**.
